This Report on the Hand Tools and Implements Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing chisels, hammers, saws, axes, shears (including sheep shears but excluding tailors' shears), scythes, spades, agricultural forks, hoes, rakes, spanners, wrenches, vices and other hand tools and tool accessories. Power tools and engineers' small tools are excluded.
This industry corresponds tominimum list heading 391 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.
The industry corresponds to the Tools and Implements Industry (Part 68) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that cutting tools for use on woodworking machinery included in the 1963 report on the Miscellaneous (Non-electrical) Machinery Industry (Part 49) are now included in this industry as are woodboring machine bits which were included in the 1963 report on the Engineers' Small Tools and Gauges Industry (Part 43).
Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.
In this industry, where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than twentyfive persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form for 1968 . For 1963 a sample of small firms was asked to complete the simplified census form, the remainder being required only to give information on employment and description of business.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
