This Report on the Steel Tubes Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing all types of steel tube and pipe, and fittings therefor, including conduits, gas cylinders and flexible tubes. Production of pig iron at blast furnaces (including ore preparation plants) at integrated tube works is included.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 312 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 38).

## METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION

The classification of returns to this industry followed the standard procedure as outlined in the notes on page (i). A different procedure was used in classifying returns to the two sub-divisions of this industry shown in Table 4; establishments which made plain straight tubing or gas cylinders or whose sales of these amounted to 10 per cent. or more of their total sales of the principal products of the industry, were allocated to the first group. The remaining establishments, mainly those primarily engaged in fabricating tubes or making tube fittings, were allocated to the second.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
