# 122 Corsets and miscellaneous dress industries

This Report on the Corsets and Miscellaneous Dress Industries relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing corsets, suspender belts, brassieres, etc; women's and girls' swimsuits and men's and boys' swimtrunks, neckties, scarves, belts and braces (not leather), garters, suspenders, cloth leggings and gaiters; wigs, theatrical costumes, artificial flowers, feather ornaments, etc; making and covering umbrellas and sunshades and manufacturing walking sticks. The making up of garments cut from purchased knitted material is included, but not the manufacture of knitted goods by establishments classified to the Hosiery and Other Knitted Goods Industry (Part 104). Workrooms attached to retail shops are also excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 449(1), (3) and (4) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 99).

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
