## 104 Hosiery and other knitted goods

This Report on the Hosiery and 0ther Knitted Goods Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in knitting fabrics on warp looms; knitting stockings, socks, garments and other goods including weft knitted fabrics. The making-up of household textiles and of clothes cut from knitted fabric is included when carried out in knitting establishments. Making-up clothes cut from purchased knitted fabric is excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 417 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Hosiery and Other Knitted Goods Industry (Part 81) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 except that lace-like products, and window net type furnishings made on Raschel and similar machines formerly shown in the Report on the Lace Industry (Part 82) are now included in this industry, as are knitted roll-on blanks and other knitted elastic and elastomeric goods of widths exceeding 30 cm .formerly included in the Report on the Narrow Fabrics Industry (Part 84).

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

An additional table (Table 5 Supplement), which is derived from short period information and which supplements the broader figures for sales given in Table 5. is included in this Report.

## TREATMENT OF FABRICS BACKED WITH PLASTIC FOAM AND FABRIC TO FABRIC BONDED MATERIALS

Fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials are shown as principal products of the same industry as the main fabric rather than the material used for the backing or bonding. Thus knitted fabrics backed with plastic foam and knitted fabric to fabric bonded materials are shown in Table 5 of this Report, and the corresponding tables in the Reports on the Woollen and Worsted Industry (Part 101) and the Weaving of Cotton, Linen and Man-made Fibres Industry (Part 100) show respectively, sales of woollen or worsted fabrics backed with plastic foam and woollen and worsted fabric to fabric bonded materials and sales of cotton fabrics backed with plastic foam and cotton fabric to fabric bonded materials. Total sales of all fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials reported in the census, together with those reported by merchant converters in a separate inquiry, are brought together in a supplement to Table 5 in the Report on the Weaving of Cotton, Linen and Man-made Fibres Industry (Part 100).

Sales of fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials were not taken into account in classifying returns to the three textile industries in which they are shown.
The foambacking of fabric on commission and fabric to fabric bonding on commission were classified to the Textile Finishing Industry (Part 110).

## METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION

The classification of returns to this industry followed the standard procedure as outlined in the notes on page (i) except for the special treatment of fabrics backed with plastic foam and fabric to fabric bonded materials referred to above. The classification of returns to sub-divisions of the industry followed the standard procedure.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
