## 93 Jewellery and precious metals

This Report on the Jewellery and Precious Metals Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in smelting, refining etc, gold, silver and platinum, etc, cutting and polishing precious stones; manufacturing ornaments of gold, silver, pewter, or plated with gold, silver, etc; and in manufacturing jewellery, coins and medals. The Royal Mint is included.
This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 396 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The Industry corresponds to Jewellery, Plate and Refining of Precious Metals Industry (Part 73) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that tableware of metals other than of gold or platinum, finished spoons and forks and blanks therefor; and knives, complete with blades, plated with precious metals formerly included in this industry are now included in the Report on the Cutlery, Spoons, Forks and Plated Tableware, etc, Industry (Part 89) while imitation, fashion and costume jewellery formerly included in this industry are now included in the Report on the Miscellaneous Manufacturing Industries (Part 150).

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.
In the jewellery and plate section of this industry, where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than twenty-five persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form for 1968 . For 1963 a sample of small firms in the jewellery and plate section of this industry was asked to complete the simplified census form, the remainder being required only to give information on employment and description of business.
There were no small establishments in this industry in Northern Ireland in 1963 and 1968.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
