TERMS USED IN THE CENSUS REPORTS

Capital expenditure
The expendi ture on new building work shown excludes the cost of 1 and and existing buildings purchased; for plant, machinery and vehicles value is that charged to capital account during the year, including any transport and installation costs involved. It includes the value of work of a capital nature carried out by under-
takings' own staff, and expendi ture in respect of establishments in Great Britain where production had not started before the end of the year

## EMPLOYMENT

Employees are classified under the two main headings of (i) administrative, technical and clerical employees and (ii) operatives. The igures relate to persons on the pay-roll (i.e. employers), whether full-time were held by employees.
Administrative, technical and clerical employees include managers, superintendents, and works foremen; research, experimental, development, technical and design employees (other than office (including works office) and showroom employees.
Operatives include all other classes of employees, that is, broadly speaking, all manual wage earners, including those employed in foremen, meter readers and collectors; maintenance workers; and cleaners. Operatives engaged in outside work of erection, fitting etc. are al so included.
intermediate products
Figures are given showing the total quantities made during the year of important inter-
mediate products, $i$, e. products which may be mediate products, i.e. products which may be further processed they are produced, whether or not they are al so
sometimes sold.
materials and fuel
The totals shown include the cost of all materials and components used in production, and of fuel (including electricity) for all purposes
including 1 ighting and transport (where carried out by firms' own staff included in the return); all packing materials, including the full cost of returnable cases and containers when first purchased; workshop materials; office materials water charges; materials for repairs to firms'
own buildings, plant and vehicles when carried out by theirs own workpeople included in the return; consumable tools; and parts for machinery purchased during the year as replacements.

The values shown include any duty paid (less rebate, materials.
NET OUTPUT
The net output of an industry represents the value added to materials by the process o production and includes the gross margin on any
merchanted or factored goods sold; it constitutes the fund from which wages, salaries, rents rates and taxes, advertising and other selling expenses, and all other similar charges have to be met, as were is no appreciable duplication in output.
Net output was obtained by taking the total value of sales and work done (including sales of appliances); adding the value of stocks o products on hand for sale at the end of the year
and deducting their value at the beginning of the year; and deducting also the cost of materials and fuel used, the cost of purchased appliances, payments for work given out to other firms, an payments for transport (other than transport inwards).

NET OUTPUT PER PERSON EMPLOYED
employed figures for net output per person employed are derived by divi

SALES
Sales include the net selling value of gas, by-products and appliances sold, rents received and work done. Any machinery or other capital items produced return are sum of wages and the cost of materials used.

The value shown for sales is the net selling value, defined as the amount charged to customer whether on an ex-works or delivered basis, net o any trade discounts, agents' commissions
allowances for returnable cases, purchase etc.; the net amount charged for packing materials is included.
establi the extent that the products of one establishment constitute the materials purchased by another, total figures of the value of sale include an element of duplication. Total sales of gas, however, are free of duplication, sale from one Gas Board to another having been excluded.
stocks
The values reported were the income tax values of stocks of products on hand for sale and of materials and fuel, at the beginning and

TRANSPORT PAYMENTS
These represent the total amount paid or redited during the year for transport (other han transport inwards). They include payments other firms, and to undertakings' own separate
ransport organisations not covered by the transport organisations not covered by the
returns, but exclude the value of transport services provided by undertakings' own employees which are covered by the returns. The items included are payments for hired cartage and for carriage by all forms of inland transport, that is railways, road haulage, canals, coast-wise ripping, air, etc. Payments made for sea
reight on goods sold to customers overseas are excluded.

These are the amounts paid during the year to operatives and to administrative, technical and clerical employees. bertime payments, bonuses and commissions whether paid regularly or not, and no deductio is made for income tax, insurances, contributo pensions, etc. The value of any payments in kin ravelling expenses, lodging allowances, etc. is excluded.

WORK GIVEN OUT
The figures shown represent the total amount
aid to outside firms for renovation of appli . ances and for work charged to consumers fo They do not include payments for business and ther services.

The figures in the tables have, wher necessary, been rounded to the nearest final digit. There may, therefore, be apparent slight iscrepancies between the sums of the constituen items and the totals shown.

## Part 129. GAS

This report on the Gas Industry relates to establishments engaged in the production and distribution of gas for public supply. Showrooms are included Establishments (other than transport undertakings) producing gas primarily for their own use are excluded, being included in the industries covering the major output of the parent works

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 601 of the new edition of the Standard Industrial Classification, which has been used for the first time in the 1958 Census. The definition of this industry is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1954, in which it was reported on as Industry F in Volume 12

This report covers all undertakings of the twelve Area Gas Boards together with the Gas Council, and gas undertakings in Northern Ireland.
