products, called princi pal products, are sidentified as products, called principal products, are identified as
characteristic of the protuction of individual trades, the principal products for a qiven trade being of
similar nature or conmonly associated in production. An similar nature or conmonly associated in propuction. An
establishment is clasifited to a trade if its output of principal products of that trade accounted for a greo-
ter proportion of the value of its output than did its output of principal products of any other trade. The establishment: The basic unit for the collection
of information is generally the establishment which in most cases comprises the whole of the premises
