#### PA500 CONSTRUCTION

The information in this report relates to undertakings engaged in the Construction industry, minimum list heading 500 in the Standard Industrial Classification (revised 1968). The activities of the industry include:

Erecting and repairing buildings of all types. Constructing and repairing roads and bridges; erecting steel and reinforced concrete structures; other civil engineering work such as laying sewers, gas and water mains, and electricity cables, erecting overhead lines and line supports and aerial masts, extracting coal from opencast workings, etc. The building and civil engineering establishments of government departments, local authorities and New Town Corporations and Commissions are included. On-site industrialised building is also included. Establishments specialising in demolition work or in sections of construction work such as asphalting, electrical wiring, flooring, glazing, installing heating and ventilating apparatus, painting, plastering, plumbing, roofing. The hiring of Contractor's plant and scaffolding is included.

The report covers the construction work done by private enterprises and by persons directly employed by Local Authorities, Public Authorities and Government Departments. It excludes construction work carried out by the employees of nationalised industries and transport and water undertakings, except for the building and civil engineering work of the British Steel Corporation and the housing departments of the National Coal Board. Contractual work on opencast coal-mining is included but the activities of the division of the National Coal Board responsible for selling the coal so obtained are excluded.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which commence on page 22.

- (a) For 1974, estimates for unsatisfactory returns, non-response and unsampled small undertakings accounted for 41 per cent by employment and 37 per cent by turnover of the total figures shown. The figures are influenced by the large number of firms employing fewer than 20 people, of which only 5 per cent were included in the census. These small firms accounted for 29 per cent of employment and 24 per cent of output in the industry. 31 per cent of issued forms were either unsatisfactory or non-returned, but only 17 per cent of forms from firms employing 100 or more people fell into this category.
- (b) In comparing 1968 and 1974 figures, the following factors should be considered
  - i. in 1973, 25,356 (mainly very small) firms which were not previously covered by DOE enquiries were added to the register which is used in this census
  - ii. following the local government re-organisation in England and Wales in 1973, the number of separate local authorities with direct labour departments was reduced. There were 1,304 such authorities in 1968 and 614 in 1974.
- (c) Not recorded separately for 1968.
- d) The figures for 1968 do not include revenue from rents for industrial buildings.
- (e) Included with other purchases.
- (f) The definition of net output was slightly different in 1968. It provided for the deduction of amounts payable to other organisations for transport of goods within the United Kingdom and for the hire of plant and machinery. Repair and maintenance costs were not deducted.
- (g) Of industrial services costs incurred by private undertakings in 1974, £3,175,775,000 was for payments for work sub-contracted out, of which £703,354,000 was paid to labour only sub-contractors.

#### Introduction

- 1. These notes give the main information needed for interpreting the figures in this industry report. More detailed information about the census, but applying particularly to the manufacturing industries, will be given in a separate booklet "Introductory Notes", Part PA 1001 of the Report on the Census of Production for 1974, to be published next year. Features in which the census for the construction industry differs from manufacturing industries are given below.
- 2. The construction industry was included in a full Annual Census of Production for the first time in 1974. The census forms part of the integrated system of industrial statistics being introduced by the Government Statistical Service. The industry was included in the 1968 quinquennial census, and for the years 1969 to 1973 there was a limited annual inquiry covering capital expenditure and stocks from a small sample of larger undertakings.
- 3. The subjects to be covered for the census were decided after consultation with the Census of Production Advisory Committee appointed under the Statistics of Trade Act, and with the Standing Consultative Committee on Construction Statistics of the National Consultative Council for the Building and Civil Engineering Industries. Manufacturing industries were subject to a Purchases Inquiry for 1974. The construction industry was not included in this inquiry, instead a limited range of purchases questions was included in the census.

#### Coverage

- 4. Census returns for Great Britain were required from all private undertakings employing 20 or more persons, but the full range of questions was only required from those employing 100 or more. Because of the relatively large proportion of output in this industry contributed by smaller businesses, a 5 per cent sample of undertakings with fewer than 20 employees was covered with a simpler form. All public authorities were required to make a return in respect of their direct labour construction work.
- 5. The Department of Commerce, Belfast, conducts an annual census of production for Northern Ireland, and data collected have been passed to the Business Statistics Office for incorporation in the tables which relate to the United Kingdom.

#### Industrial classification

- The census was conducted on the Business Statistics Office's construction register. This register is constructed from the Department of the Environment's builders address file of establishments in Great Britain engaged in construction (as defined in the Standard Industrial Classification minimum list heading 500), to which the addresses of Public Authorities direct labour departments have been added. The register includes details of industry sub-division classification (used in tables 1A and 2A) obtained by the Department of the Environment in their Private Contractors Construction Census taken annually in October. As part of the Contractors census respondents are asked to indicate from a list of the various specialist classes of construction business the description most appropriate to their business. The Business Statistics Office further sub-divides private contractors between 'main contracts' and 'sub-contractors' according to their major activity, measured in terms of the value of work done. 'Plant hiring contractors' are all classed as 'sub-contractors'.
- 7. Following our membership of the European Economic Communities an additional industrial classification of private contributors to the census is necessary. Figures on this basis will enable comparison to be made between figures of member states. This classification, "Nomenclature of Economic Activities in the European Communities" (NACE) has been used in tables 5(i) and 5(ii). Each census form carried a list of activities from which respondents were asked to select the one most appropriate to the main activity of the business

### Details of NACE classification for construction are as follows:

- 500 General building and civil engineering work (without any particular specialisation) and demolition work.
- Construction of buildings. This includes general building contracting and restoration and repair work on outside walls as well as roofing, waterproofing and damp-proofing, erection and dismantling of scaffolding, structural carpentry, and other such specialised activities relating directly to the construction of buildings.
- Civil engineering, including construction of roads, bridges, railways, tunnels, shaft drilling, earth-moving, construction work relating to irrigation, drainage, water supply, sewerage, etc.
- Installation work including installation of fixtures and fittings, including gas fittings, plumbing, sanitary equipment, heating, ventilating, insulation, electrical wiring and fittings; installation of aerials, lightning conductors, telephones, etc.
- Building completion work, including plastering, on-site joinery, painting, glazing, paperhanging, wall and floor tiling and covering, and other such specialised activities relating directly to the completion of buildings.

The following activities, within the construction heading under the Standard Industrial Classification, are not included in construction under NACE classification.

#### Opencast coal-mining

Plant hire (without labour). When plant is hired with labour, the work is classified according to the most appropriate activity for which the plant is used.

#### Estimation of Figures

- 8. Estimates have been made in the Business Statistics Office for non-response, unsatisfactory returns and unsampled small firms in order to obtain totals for the industry as a whole. For Great Britain, ratio estimates were obtained from satisfactory returns using as the auxilliary variables either employment or output figures obtained in the Department of the Environment's annual census for 1974. Separate estimates were calculated for each industry sub-division by employment size strata. For Northern Ireland, the Department of Commerce made individual estimates for non-response, using the latest information available from quarterly output returns and previous census returns; for unsampled small firms estimation was made by the Business Statistics Office on the basis of employment figures supplied by the Department of Commerce.
- 9. Additionally, respondents were asked to make reasonable estimates wherever exact figures were not readily available.

#### Description of tables

10. Of the tables, all except tables 4A and 4B include estimates for non-response, unsatisfactory returns and non-sampled businesses.

Tables 4A and 4B are based on returns received only. All tables relate to the United Kingdom; tables 1A and 2A show separate figures for Great Britain analysed by industry sub-divisions and by main and sub-contractors, and for Northern Ireland analysed by main and sub-contractors. Tables 1A, 2A and 4A are for private contractors only, tables 1B, 2B and 4B relate to the public sector.

#### TERMS USED IN THE CENSUS REPORT

### Average number employed

- 11. Undertakings were required to state the number of persons on the payroll (i.e. whose national insurance cards were held by them) on the average during the year of return, whether full-time or part-time employees. Separate figures were required for (a) administrative, professional, technical and clerical employees and (b) all other employees (operatives and apprentices). It was advised that averages could be calculated from figures relating to the last week of each calendar month. Undertakings were also required to state the number of working proprietors where appropriate and these are included in total employment figures, but not in (a) or (b) above.
- 2. The figures include persons engaged in merchanting or factoring and canteen workers where particulars in respect of these activities could not be excluded from the return.

#### Working proprietors

13. These include all persons regarded as 'self employed' for national insurance purposes and members of their families who worked in the business without receiving a fixed wage or salary; but such persons who worked less than half the normal number of working hours are excluded. Directors working in the business but not in receipt of a definite wage, salary or commission are included under this heading; directors paid by fee only are not included.

#### Employee

- 14. Administrative, professional, technical and clerical employees include directors in receipt of a definite wage, salary or commission, managers, surveyors, engineers and other professionals, and foremen, research and design staff (other than operatives), draughtsmen, editorial staff, advertising staff, travellers and all office employees. Public authorities were asked to include only such a proportion of total office and management staff as was fairly attributable to the building and civil engineering work carried out by direct employees.
- 15. Operatives include all other employees, both on and off-site. They include manual wage earners, including apprentices; operatives in warehouses, shops and canteens, inspectors, maintenance and transport workers and cleaners.

#### Capital expenditur

- 16. Capital expenditure in respect of units not yet in operation is included in the figures. Undertakings were asked not to deduct from the value of capital expenditure, amounts received in grants or allowances from the Government or any Statutory Body (or Local Authority).
  - a. New building work

This represents the cost incurred during the year of new building and other constructional work to be used in connection with the business covered by the return. The value is that charged to capital account during the year of return; it includes expenditure on new buildings and on the extension or reconstruction of old buildings, the value of works of a capital nature carried out by the undertakings' own staff and the cost of any newly constructed buildings purchased. Figures shown include any legal charges, stamp duties, agents' commissions, etc.

b. Land and existing buildings

The items shown are the capital costs of freeholds purchased and the capital cost of premium payable for leaseholds acquired (excluding the value of any assets acquired in taking over an existing business), and the amounts receivable for any freeholds or leaseholds disposed of. The value is that charged to capital account during the year of return.

c. Plant, machinery and vehicles

The items shown are the value of plant and machinery and of vehicles acquired, both new and second-hand, and the amount received for items disposed of during the year. The value of plant and machinery acquired includes plant, etc., which firms produced for their own use in connection with the business covered by the return. The value of plant, etc., acquired is the expenditure charged to capital account during the year of return less any discounts received, but including the cost of transport and installation. Deductible value added tax is excluded, but non-deductible value added tax on motor cars acquired is included. No deduction is made for depreciation, amortization or obsolescence. The proceeds of items disposed of during the year exclude amounts written off for items scrapped.

#### Gross output

17. For the calculation of gross output the value of work done, sales of goods and receipts for plant hire is increased by the rise (or reduced by the fall) during the year in the value of stocks of goods on hand for sale.

#### Net output

18. Net output, a customary census measure, is calculated by deducting from gross output the cost of purchases, (reduced by the rise or increased by the fall, during the year in the value of stocks of fuel and raw materials), the cost of work sub-contracted out and of other industrial services.

#### Net output per head

19. The figures of net output per head are derived by dividing the net output by the average number of persons employed (full time and part-time) on all activities covered by the returns, including operatives, administrative, professional, technical and clerical employees and working proprietors.

#### Gross value added at factor cost

- 20. Gross value added at factor cost is calculated by deducting from net output the cost of non-industrial services received (rent of buildings and capital equipment, commercial insurance premiums, bank charges and amounts paid for professional services, postal etc. services, transport, advertising etc.) and certain indirect taxes (vehicle licences and rates). This estimate of gross value added approaches more closely than census net output to the definition of net output or value added used in national accounts statistics.
- 21. Gross value added at factor cost per head.

The figures of gross value added at factor cost per head are derived by dividing the gross value added at factor cost by the average number of persons employed (full time and part-time) on all activities covered by the returns, including operatives, administrative, professional, technical and clerical employees and working proprietors.

#### Purchases

- 22. Purchases include the cost of materials and goods used or incorporated in building and civil engineering work or in production; of fuel and electricity for all purposes; of packaging materials, including the full cost of returnable cases and containers when first purchased; of workshop materials, office materials and materials for repairs to establishments' own buildings, plants and vehicles carried out by their own work people included in the return; of consumable tools, and of parts for machinery purchased during the year as replacements. Water charges are also included. Purchases of goods for merchanting or factoring and canteen supplies were collected separately. Materials supplied by customers for processing are excluded, as are all purchases charged to capital account.
- 23. The values shown exclude value added tax but include any duty paid (less rebate, etc.). Values exclude trade discounts allowed. The cost of transport is included only if included in the cost of materials as invoiced; amounts paid to transport organisations, including an establishments' own separate transport organisations, for delivery of materials and fuel are therefore excluded. Materials purchased overseas are included at their cost cif cost plus any duty payable if the cost of transport from the docks was not included in the invoiced price, but at their full delivery cost as invoiced 'carriage paid home'.
- 24. Materials and fuel transferred from another department of the establishment not covered by the same return are included at the estimated selling value recorded by the other department.

#### Stocks

25. Values are given of stocks of materials and fuels, and of goods on hand for sale, at the beginning and end of the year of return, including any stocks of goods held for merchanting or factoring. Values exclude value added tax.

#### Wages and salaries

26. These are the amounts paid during the year to operatives and administrative, professional, technical and clerical employees. Payments to working proprietors, whether called salaries or not, are excluded. The values shown include all overtime payments, bonuses and commissions, whether paid regularly or not, and no deduction is made for income tax, insurance, contributory pensions, etc. The value of any payments in kind, travelling expenses, lodging allowances, etc. and employers' contributions to national insurance and pension schemes are excluded.

#### Employers' insurance and welfare contributions

27. Values shown include the employers' contribution to national insurance and graduated pensions, as well as commercial insurance premiums to provide pensions, superannuation or other retirement benefits, sickness benefits, personal accident benefits, disability or death benefits for employees or former employees or their dependants. Contributions to running costs of canteens, social centres, childrens' and holiday homes, etc., for employees, former employees and their dependants are also included.

## Work done and goods sold

- 28. Values shown are exclusive of value added tax.
- 29. For work done the value shown is the net contract price of the work if the contract was executed wholly within the year of return; otherwise an appropriate proportion of the net contract price representing the value of work done during the year. It includes the value of all goods used or incorporated in the work done.
- 30. Sales are in respect of goods made, goods bought and sold without processing, and waste products. Goods incorporated in the building and civil engineering work are excluded.
- 31. The value shown for sales is the net selling value charged to customers, excluding any trade discounts, agents' commissions, etc. The net amount charged for packing materials is included.

#### SYMBOLS USED

- 32. The following symbols are used throughout the report:
  - .. not available
  - nil or less than half the final digit shown
  - \* figures cannot be shown owing to the risk of disclosing information about individual enterprises.

#### ROUNDING OF FIGURES

33. Figures in the tables have, where necessary, been rounded to the nearest final digit; there may be an apparent slight discrepancy between the sum of the constituent items and the total shown.
