## THE CANE AND WICKER FURNITURE AND BASKETWARE TRADE

## INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises private firms that were engaged wholly or mainly. in the manufacture of cane and wicker furniture and baskets. Philanthropic institutions that produced basketware were not required to make returns.

As quantitative particulars of output and oversea trade were not recorded, Table VI relating to average values is not included for this trade.
