## THE HAT AND CAP TRADE

## INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of hats and caps, and of hatters' wares. Millinery making is not dealt with in this report but in that on the Tailoring, Dressmaking, Millinery, etc., Trades (see page 402).

In 1924 the value of the gross output of the small firms making returns was 3.7 per cent. of the total, the principal products affected being hats, caps and other headgear of straw ( 8.5 per cent.) and of other materials (except felt and cloth) ( 6.9 per cent.) and work done for the trade or on commission (II-9 per cent.).
