## 22 British wines, cider and perry

This Report on the British Wines, Cider and Perry Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing British wines, cider and perry and apple pectin. Bottling and canning by manufacturers of British wines etc are included, but establishments engaged wholly or mainly in bottling or canning drinks purchased from other firms (or in bottling or canning on commission) are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 239(2) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry was included in the Soft Drinks, British Wines, Cider and Perry Industry (Part 20) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963. The manufacture of soft drinks (including fruit juices) shown as a subdivision of the industry in the 1963 Report is now the subject of a separate Report for 1968.

In this industry a sample of establishments employing fewer than 25 persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form for the 1963 census but for 1968 all small establishments were required to give information only on employment and description of business.

Throughout this Report the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms which provided limited information only has been arbitrary.

There were no larger establishments in this industry in Northern Ireland in 1963 and 1968 .

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
