and periodicals, who were not also publishers, recorded the value of the and periodicals, who were not also publishers, recorded the value of the printing work done, including the cost of the paper when supplied by hem.
As indicated in the introductory note, returns were not generally required from publishers that gave out all their printing to other firms, and the total cost of publication (except printing) of newspapers and ever, returns were obtained from certain important publishers of daily newspapers that did no printing, the total value of their output of these publications being $£ 3,466,000$. As the amount paid by these firms for work given out was about $£ 1,200,000$ the total value of daily news papers published in this country in 1935 may be estimated at about $£ 32 \frac{1}{2}$ million. Returns were also received from a number of publishers of other news papers and magazines etc. that did no printing and while the output of these publications is not sufficiently complete to enable totals to be estimated, the aggregate output is known to be deficient by at least $£ 2$ million, the deficiency being greater for magazines ets. than for newspapers not published daily.
