THE PRINTING AND PUBLICATION OF NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS

INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms whose business consisted wholly or mainly in the printing and the publishing of newspapers and periodicals. Publishers who did not do their own printing but gave it out to other firms were not, in general, required to make returns.

Tables VI and VIII are not included for this trade.

Publishers who did their own printing were required to value their output on the basis of their total receipts in the year, including those from sales, subscriptions and advertisements. Printers of newspapers and periodicals, who were not also publishers, recorded the value of the printing work done, including the cost of the paper when supplied by them

As indicated in the introductory note, returns were not generally required from publishers that gave out all their printing to other firms, and the total cost of publication (except printing) of newspapers and periodicals owned by these firms thus escaped record. For 1935, however, returns were obtained from certain important publishers of daily newspapers that did no printing, the total value of their output of these publications being £3,466,000. As the amount paid by these firms for work given out was about £1,200,000 the total value of daily newspapers published in this country in 1935 may be estimated at about £32½ million. Returns were also received from a number of publishers of other newspapers and magazines etc. that did no printing and while the output of these publications is not sufficiently complete to enable totals to be estimated, the aggregate output is known to be deficient by at least £2 million, the deficiency being greater for magazines etc. than for newspapers not published daily.
