## textile converting trade

THIS REPORT on the Textile Converting Trade relates to establishments in Great Britain engaged wholly or mainly in converting cloth of cotton and of rayon, nylon, etc. to the finished state, and in procuring the making-up of household textiles of these materials; household textile are, however, regarded as principal products of the Made-up Household
Textiles Trade, and the amounts of these made and sold in this trade are shewn in the report on that trade. The work of finishing and making-up is in the main given out to other firms working on cormission, and is covered by the reports on the Textile Finishing Trade and the Made-up Household Textiles Trade.

The same form was sent to all firms on the register for this trade, and the tables in this report relate, therefore, to all establishments irrespective of size.

This trade is included in minimum list heading $244(3)$ in the Standard Industrial Classification.
