## 21 Spirit distilling and compounding

This Report on the Spirit Distilling and Compounding Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in distilling, rectifying, compounding and blending spirits, but distilling industrial alcohol and methylating spirits is excluded. Bottling by distillers, blenders etc, is included, but establishments engaged wholly or mainly in bottling drinks purchased from other firms (or in bottling on commission) are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 239(1) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 19).

In interpreting the data in the tablesit is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
