## 109 Canvas goods and sacks, etc.

This Report on the Canvas Goods and Sacks, etc Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing sacks and bags, tents, awnings, tarpaulins, sails, made-up filter cloths, etc.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 422(2) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 86).

In this industry where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than twenty-five persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
