- 3. The figures in this report cannot be regarded as accurate to the last digit shown, though for convenience of presentation most of the values are given to the nearest £ thousand. As the figures have been rounded to the nearest final digit, there may be in some tables apparent slight discrepancies between the sums of the constituent items and the totals shown.

- 5. 
