SHOP AND OFFICE FITTING TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Shop and Office Fitting Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture (including installation) of shop, office, bank, bar and hotel fittings, show cases, display and exhibition stands, shop fronts, shop and sun blinds, or in signwriting.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 172 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland are excluded in both 1948 and 1935. Particulars of the very small production in Northern Ireland for 1935 are included in the report on the Building and Contracting Trade (Volume 12, Trade A).
