## 13 Cocoa, chocolate and sugar confectionery

This Report on the Cocoa, Chocolate and Sugar Confectionery Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing cocoa powder, drinking chocolate and chocolate confectionery of all kinds, boiled sweets, toffee, caramels, marzipan, liquorice, chewing gum and all other types of sweets. Cocoa butter is included.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 217 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 13).

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
