## 69 Surgical instruments and appliances

This Report on the Surgical Instruments and Appliances Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing surgical cutlery, dental instruments, splints, trusses, artificial eyes, artificial teeth and artificial limbs and other surgical and dental appliances except items made of plastics materials; spectacles, monocles, goggles, etc including frames and lenses. Electro-medical equipment and X-ray apparatus are excluded. Dispensing opticians other than wholesale are also excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 353 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry formed part of the Scientific, Surgical and Photographic Instruments, etc Industry (Part 53) in the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, comprising part of the sub-division 'Spectacles etc' and the sub-division 'Surgical, dental and veterinary instruments and appliances', with the following exceptions: oxygen breathing apparatus are now included whereas electro-medical apparatus and hearing aids with valve or transistor amplification are excluded and included in the report on Radio, Radar and Electronic Capital Goods (Part 77); artificial teeth, crowns and facings and all other dental goods of plastics manufacture as well as artificial eyes and limbs of plastics manufacture are included in the report on Plastics Products (Part 149); and ophthalmic instruments and appliances and parts thereof are included in the report on Scientific and Industrial Instruments and Systems (Part 70).

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
