THIS REPORT on the Hardware, Hollow-ware, Metal Furniture and Sheet Metal Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of a large variety of finished metal goods including domestic and industrial hollow-ware, metal boxes and containers, metal
furniture, metal windows and door frames, safes, locks, latches and keys. Most of the produ proper to this trade are made of iron and steel, but in some cases non-ferrous metals form the proper to this trade are made of iron and steel, but in some cases non-ferrous me
main or sole materials; goods wholly of brass are, however, generally excluded.

This trade corresponds to minimum list headings 94 and \(99(1,2,3\) and 7) in the Standard Industrial Classification.
