\section*{WOOLLEN AND WORSTED TRADE}

THIS REPORT on the Woollen and Worsted Trade relates to establishments ared wholly or mainly in the sorting, blending, scouring and carbonising engaged wholly or mainly in the sorting, blending, scouring and carbonising
of wool and other animal hair, the recovery of wool from rags, and all inter mediate processes up to and including the weaving of woollen and worsted fabrics, the manufacture of wool felt and the manufacture of wool blankets, fabrics, the manufacture rayon, nylon, etc. staple fibre by woollen and worsted spinners is included.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 112 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland (which are excluded in 1948) accounted in 1935 for less than one per cent. Of the net output for the United Kingdom.
