## MISCELLANEOUS PRESERVED FOODS TRADE

This report on the Miscellaneous Preserved Foods Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of soups and soup powders, blanc mange powder, cake mixtures, coffee essences and extracts, fish and meat pastes, vegetarian foods, etc., and in fish canning, flour blending
and salt processing (other than at salt mines or brine pits). Establishment mainly engaged in flour blending were classified in 1935 in the Bread, Cakes etc. Trade, a trade not covered by the 1937 Inquiry: Table 1 gives as well as the full totals for 1935, figures for that year relating to the sections of the trade included in the 1937 Inquiry.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 162(6) in the Standard Industrial Classification, except that establishments wholly or mainly engaged in the manufacture of ice, which are included in this heading, have been dealt with in a separate report (Volume 9, Trade F) as have salt processing establishments attached to salt mines or brine pits (Volume 1, Trade C).

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948; no establishments there in this trade were separately distinguished for 1937 or 1935.
