## THE MANUFACTURED STATIONERY TRADE

## NTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of notepaper, envelopes, paper bags, tickets, cards, letter files and other articles of paper and cardboard (except cardboard boxes).
