This Report on the Miscellaneous Metal Goods Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing metal casements, window frames, door frames and skylights, curtain walling, etc; safes and strong rooms, cash and deed boxes and all types of locks and keys except time locks and locks for vehicles; spiral and flat (including laminated) springs for all purposes but excluding vehicle suspension springs and vehicle engine valve springs; metal sewing, knitting, hosiery and gramophone needles; toilet, safety, hair and hat pins; crochet hooks and fish hooks, and metal smallwares of all kinds for the clothing, fancy leather goods, harness and saddlery, etc trades, such as bag clasps and frames, buckles, hooks and eyes, snap fasteners, zip fasteners, domestic chain, etc; domestic gas appliances for cooking, heating, washing, etc other than of cast iron excluding gas central heating systems, gas-operated refrigerators and gas meters; metal closures for bottles, jars and similar containers including crown corks and heavy grade closures for drums, etc but excluding metal parts and components of cans and metal boxes and of containers of other materials; anchors, grapnels and drags, chains (including non-precision chains for vehicles) and accessories such as shackles, couplings and crane hooks; hand trucks and wheel barrows, primarily of metal, including parts such as wheels and axles. includes cold pressing, stamping and piercing base metals in the production of metal goods not reported elsewhere for the motor vehicle, mechanical and electrical metal goods not reported elsewhere for the motor ventere, methalical and electrical engineering, furniture, construction, etc trades; grinding, polishing, enamelling, engineering, plating, lacquering, galvanising and other metal finishing processes; gilding, plating, lacquering, galvanising in base metals and welding. The ship breaking; and general sheet metal working in base metals and welding. production of engineers' non-ferrous stamping and pressings is excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 399(2), (3),(4),(8),(9),(10),(11) and (12) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of calculation in the 1968 Census.

The industry formed part of the Miscellaneous Metal Manufactures Industry (Part 74) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that finished parts and accessories for motor vehicles including bumpers, fuel tanks, locks, coil suspension springs and laminated springs formerly shown in this industry are now included in the Report on the Motor Vehicle Manufacturing Industry (Part 82); pressings in sheet metal of aluminium and aluminium alloys formerly included in this industry also are now included in the Aluminium and Aluminium Alloys Industry (Part 47); hand carts, trucks and trolleys mainly of metal and wheelbarrows, not of wood, formerly shown in the Report on Perambulators, Hand-trucks, etc Industry (Part 67) and gas appliances (other than meters) formerly included in the Miscellaneous (Non-electrical) Machinery Industry (Part 49) are now included in this industry. The manufacture of metal furniture, steel drop forgings, drop stampings and hot pressings of iron and steel, domestic hollow-ware, and industrial hollowware were each shown as sub-divisions of the industry in the 1963 Report but are now the subject of separate reports, viz Metal Furniture (Part 94); Drop Forgings, etc (Part 95); and Metal Hollow-ware (Part 96).

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified as far as possible according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
