## 96 Metal hollow-ware

This Report on the Metal Hollow-ware Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing domestic hollow-ware including kettles, saucepans, teapots, buckets and similar domestic articles of base metal but not domestic tableware of stainless šteel and electroplated; industrial hollow-ware including metal kegs, drums, barrels, tanks, vats, cisterns (other than cast iron cisterns) etc. Cans of tin or aluminium, and hollow-ware fitted with an electric element for heating are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list headings 399(6) and 399(7) in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry formed part of the Miscellaneous Metal Manufactures Industry (Part 74) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i)to(iv)
