FURNITURE AND UPHOLSTERY TRADE
THIS REPORT on the Furniture and Upholstery Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture or repair of domestic, office, school, church, theatre and cinema furniture of wood, cane, wicker or woven fibre, in upholstering furniture, whether on wood or metal frames, and in the manufacture of wooden wireless cabinets. The manufacture of metal furniture, divan beds, mattresses, shop and
office fittings, display and exhibition stands, blinds and basketware is excluded. Seven Government establishments are included for 1948 .

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 171(2) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland (which are excluded in 1948) accounted in 1935 for less than 1 per cent. of the net output for the United Kingdom
