## INTRODUCTORY

These trades comprise firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the rectifying, compounding and methylating of spirits.

[^0]The value of dutiable spirits rectified, compounded, etc., for home consumption was returned inclusive of duty, whilst the value of spirits exported was recorded less drawbacks.
The quantity of methylated spirits shown in the above table represents only that made for sale by methylators and distillers and does not include spirit methylated by firms, under Excise control, for their own manufacturing purposes. According to the Excise returns, the total quantity of spirit received free of duty for methylation was 15,449, 100 proof gallons in the calendar year 1935 and 10,709,300 proof gallons in the calendar year 1930.

The figures shown in the preceding table include the following output of methylated and rectified or compounded spirits recorded by firms whose returns were made on schedules for other trades and are not, therefore, included in Table I A; separate particulars of methylated spirits cannot be given owing to the disclosure of information relating to individual firms.

Exports of home-made methylated spirits amounted to 52,800 proof gallons in 1935 and to 64,100 proof gallons in I930. Imports of methylated spirits were not recorded separately. Particulars relating to exports and retained imports of rectified and compounded spirits are included with those of plain spirits (see the Spirit Distilling Trade, page 192).
