FISH CURING

THE FISH CURING TRADE

INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the curing, smoking and salting of fish. Owing to the exclusion of firms employing not more than ten persons, the deficiencies in the aggregates shown in the following tables are likely to be substantial. For this reason, the recorded particulars of production are not compared in Table VIII with those of exports and imports.

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
