## LINEN AND SOFT HEMP TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Linen and Soft Hemp Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the spinning and weaving of linen and soft hemp and in making-up for sale household textiles of linen and union cloth.
This trade, together with the Flax Processing Trade, corresponds to minimum list heading 115 and part of $122 / 2$ in the Standard Industrial Classification.
Certain figures for Northern Ireland are not strictly comparable with those for Great Britain In Northern Ireland returns were obtained from firms engaged in the spinning, weaving, threadnaking, and textile converting and making-up sections of the trade, and firms engaged in two or俍 fors of figures as sales of output and purchases of materials.
igures as sales of output and purchases of materials.
In the weaving, textile converting and making-up sections of the industry in Northern Ireland no distinction was made between establishments dealing with linen cloth and those dealing with loths of cotton, rayon, nylon etc., all being included in this trade
The output in Northern Ireland of linen and soft hemp is included in the sales of principal products shown in Table 20: sales shown in Tables 8 and 10 are for Great Britain only.
