



## MARGARINE TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Margarine Trade relates to establishments ngace wholly or mainly in the manufacture of margarine, compound lard and compound cooking fats.

This trade corresponds with minimum list heading $162(1)$ in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948 production was recorded there in this trade in 1937 or 1935

Margarine, compound lard and compound cooking fats for home onsumption were produced by this trade in 1948 for the Ministry of Food and this output appears in gross output as amounts charged for work done and not selling values; the corresponding amounts of naterials supplied by the Ministry of fom the total of materials purchased and used
