\section*{WHOLESALE BOTTLING TRADE}

THIS REPORT on the Wholesale Bottling Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the wholesale bottling of beer, wines, spirits, mineral waters, etc., (but not milk, for which see the Milk orewers and distillers, and whisky blenders who are not distillers are brewers and
included.

Some brewing firms that maintained bottling establishments were unable to furnish separate returns for the latter, and, therefore, included their bottling departments in the general returns for the breweries.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 164 in the Standard Industrial Classification.
stablishments in this trade in Northern Ireland (which are excluded I 1948) accounted in 1935 for about 1 per cent. of the net output for the United Kingdom.
