## GLASS CONTAINERS TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Glass Containers Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of glass bottles, bottle stoppers, jars, syphons and vacuum flasks.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 23 in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948; no production was recorded there in this trade for 1937 or 1935.
