This Report on the Sugar Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture or refining of sugar, syrup and treacle, molasses and invert sugar.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 216 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 12).

There were no establishments in this industry in Northern Ireland in 1963 and 1968.

METHOD OF CLASSIFICATION

The classification of returns to this industry followed the standard procedure as outlined in the notes which appear on page (i), but in classifying returns to the sub-divisions of the industry, establishments of the British Sugar Corporation Ltd. were allocated to the group headed 'Beet sugar' and all other establishments to the other group.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
