SUMMARY TABLES

NOTES

1. This Business Monitor presents summary information of the Census of Production for 1976, at establishment and enterprise level. Comparative data for 1973–1975 is given in establishment tables 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. Where revised figures have become available since the publication of the separate industry Monitors, the opportunity has been taken to include them in these summary tables. The Census of Production for 1976 is the seventh of the annual series, which forms part of a system of industrial statistics which was mainly brought into operation between 1970 and 1973. The rest of the system comprises selected monthly inquiries into manufacturers' sales, orders and production, quarterly inquiries into the product sales of manufacturing industries and less frequent inquiries into additional subjects including details of purchases of goods and services by industry. The notes below give the main information needed for interpreting the figures, more detailed information about the census is given in a separate Business Monitor — PA1001 (Introductory Notes), Report on the Census of Production 1976.

2. **Suppression of information relating to individual undertakings**

The summary tables have been prepared in conformity with the disclosure provisions of the Statistics of Trade Act, 1947. In order to avoid disclosing information about individual undertakings it has in some cases not been possible to publish information in the full detail in which it was collected.

3. **Symbols used**

The following symbols are used throughout the PA series of Business Monitors:

.. not available

— nil or less than half the final digit shown

* figures cannot be shown owing to the risk of disclosing information about individual enterprises

4. **Rounding of figures**

Figures in the tables have, where necessary, been rounded to the nearest final digit. Where figures have been so rounded, the sum of the constituent items may not always agree exactly with the total shown.

5. **Order and higher aggregation**

Where no footnote is given against an Order or higher aggregation the reader should nevertheless refer to and take into account any notes given against the constituent industries or Orders.

6. **Industrial Classification**

The United Kingdom Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) was first issued in 1948 and revised in 1958 and 1968. It exists to promote uniformity and comparability in the official statistics of the United Kingdom. The general principles followed are those of the International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities of the United Nations Statistical Office but the United Kingdom SIC, reflects the organisation and structure of industry and trade as it exists in the United Kingdom. The SIC is a classification by activity and is not a commodity classification. However, an index of all commodity headings for which sales data are provided in the Quarterly Business Monitors is published in Business Monitor PQ1000.

7. **Statistical Units**

The main statistical unit for the purpose of a census is the establishment defined in the SIC as the smallest unit which can provide the information normally required for an economic census, for example, employment, expenses, turnover, capital formation. Sometimes activities which are conducted as a single business are carried on at a number of addresses. Where this is so, businesses are asked to provide the full range of separate information in respect of each address, whether or not the activities are different. Their activities may be integrated to such an extent that they constitute a single establishment. In that case the establishment is defined to cover the combined activities at these addresses (termed local units). Separate figures are obtained, however, of employment and net capital expenditure at each unit. For certain purposes in the annual censuses of production two or more establishments under common ownership or control are combined into an enterprise. The bringing together of establishments into enterprise groups is used to ensure that there will be no disclosure of the activities of any one enterprise group.

8. **Coverage**

The census for 1973–1976, covered United Kingdom establishments engaged in manufacturing, mining and quarrying, electricity, gas and water supply (Orders II–XIX and XXI of the Standard Industrial Classification (revised 1968) (SIC)). Since 1974, the censuses have been extended to cover the construction industry (Order XX). For 1973 and subsequent years, a return was required from each establishment with 20 or more employees. In the construction industry (1974–1976), where firms employing less than 20 persons account for a relatively high proportion of total employment and output, a sample was taken of undertakings with less than 20 employees.

TERMS USED IN THE CENSUS REPORT

9. **Average number employed**

Establishments were required to state the number of persons on the payroll on average during the year of return, whether full-time or part-time employees. Separate figures were required for:

- a. Administrative, technical and clerical employees
b. All other employees (operatives)

Averages could be calculated from the figures relating to the last week of each calendar month. Establishments were also required to state the number of working proprietors where appropriate and these are included in total employment figures. Outworkers (i.e. persons employed by establishments who worked in their own homes, etc. on materials supplied by the establishment) are excluded. The figures include persons engaged on merchanting or factoring and canteen workers where particulars in respect of these activities could not be excluded from the return.

10. Working proprietors

These include all persons regarded as "self-employed" for national insurance purposes and members of their families who worked in the business without receiving a wage or salary; but such persons who worked less than half the normal number of working hours are excluded. Directors working in the business but not in receipt of a definite wage, salary or commission are included under this heading: directors paid by fee only are not included.

11. Employees

Administrative, technical and clerical employees include directors in receipt of a definite wage, salary or commission, managers, superintendents and works foremen; research, design employees (other than operatives); draughtsmen, editorial staff, advertising staff, travellers and all office employees.

Operatives include all other classes of employees, that is, broadly speaking, all manual wage earners. They include operatives employed in power stations, transport (including roundsmen), warehouses, stores, shops and canteens, inspectors, maintenance workers and cleaners. Operatives engaged in outside work of erecting, fitting, etc. are also included, but outworkers are excluded.

12. Capital expenditure

Capital expenditure during the year in respect of manufacturing units where production had not started before the end of the year is included. Establishments were asked not to deduct from the value of capital expenditure amounts received or expected to be received in grants or allowances from the Government or any statutory body or local authority. Establishments with 100 or more employees were also asked to include a total net capital expenditure figure for the calendar year.

a. New building work.

This represents the cost incurred during the year of new building and other constructional work to be used in connection with the business covered by the return. The value is that charged to capital account during the year of return; it includes expenditure on new buildings and on the extension or reconstruction of old buildings, the value of works of a capital nature carried out by the establishment's own staff and the cost of any newly constructed buildings purchased. Figures shown include any legal charges, stamp duties, agents' commissions, etc.

b. Land and existing buildings

The items shown are the capital cost of freeholds purchased and the capital cost or premium payable for leaseholds acquired (excluding the value of any assets acquired in taking over an existing business), and the amounts receivable for any freeholds or leaseholds disposed of. The value is that charged to capital account during the year of return.

c. Plant, machinery and vehicles

The items shown are the value of plant and machinery and of vehicles acquired, both new and second-hand, and the amount received for items disposed of during the year. The value of plant and machinery acquired includes plant, etc. which firms produced for their own use in connection with the business covered by the return. The value of plant, etc. acquired is the expenditure charged to capital account during the year of return less any discounts received, but including the cost of transport and installation. Deductible value added tax is excluded but non-deductible value added tax on motor cars acquired is included. No deduction is made for depreciation, amortization or obsolescence. The proceeds of items disposed of during the year exclude amounts written-off for items scrapped.

13. Cost of industrial services

This includes amounts payable to other firms for work done on materials supplied by the establishment, payments for repairs and maintenance (including those in respect of rented buildings) and amounts paid to other firms for contracts which have been sublet. Payments to outworkers are excluded.

14. Cost of non-industrial services

This includes rent of industrial and commercial buildings, hire of plant and machinery, commercial insurance premiums, bank charges and amounts paid for professional services, post office services, transport, advertising etc. Amounts payable on royalties for the right to use patents, trademarks, copyrights etc., manufacturing and quarrying rights and technical "know-how" are also included.

15. Gross output

In the calculation of gross output the value of total sales and work done is increased by the rise (or reduced by the fall) during the year in the value of work in progress and goods on hand for sale.

16. Net output

Net output, a customary census measure, is calculated by deducting from gross output the cost of purchases (reduced by the rise, or increased by the fall, during the year of stocks of materials etc.) and the cost of industrial services received, and where applicable, duties etc.

17. Net output per head

The figures of net output per head are derived by dividing the net output by the average number of persons employed (full and part-time) on all activities covered by the returns, including operatives, administrative, technical and clerical employees and working proprietors, but excluding outworkers.

18. Gross value added at factor cost

Gross value added at factor cost is calculated by deducting from net output the cost of non-industrial services (e.g. rent of buildings, hire of plant and machinery, commercial insurance premiums, bank charges and amounts paid for professional services, post office services, transport and advertising), rates (excluding water rates) and the cost of licensing motor vehicles. This estimate of gross value added approaches more closely than census net output to the definition of net output or value added in national accounts statistics.

19. Gross value added at factor cost per head

The figures of gross value added at factor cost per head are derived by dividing the gross value added by the average number of persons employed (full and part-time) on all activities covered by the returns, including operatives, administrative, technical and clerical employees and working proprietors, but excluding outworkers.

20. Purchases

Purchases include the cost of raw materials, components, semi-manufactured goods and workshop materials; of replacement parts and consumable tools not charged to capital account; of packaging materials of all types; of stationery and printed matter; of fuel, electricity and water; of materials to be used by the establishment or given out to other establishments for the production of machinery or other capital items for the establishment's own use; of materials for use by the establishment when working on goods supplied by customers; and of food, etc. for any canteen covered by the establishment's return. Transfers of goods to the establishment from another department of the same firm not covered by the establishment's return are included at a cost corresponding to the estimated selling value recorded by the other department. Amounts payable to transport firms or credited to the firm's own transport department for delivery of materials are excluded, as are all purchases of machinery and plant charged to capital account. Purchases of goods for merchanting or factoring have been collected separately. The values shown exclude VAT. They include, in addition to the actual purchase price, the value of packaging material charged to the establishment. The value of returned goods or packaging material returned to suppliers and any trade discounts are excluded. Materials purchased duty-paid are included at their duty-paid value, less any drawback, rebate, etc. The cost of transport is included only if it is included with the purchase price in the firm's accounts. Imported goods are included at their full delivered cost. If in the firm's accounts the transport from docks or airport is not included in the cost of goods purchased, the cost is entered at c.i.f. plus duty (if applicable). Leasing, renting and hire purchase charges are excluded.

21. Sales of goods produced

Sales for the purposes of the annual censuses means deliveries on sale of goods made by establishments in the United Kingdom covered by the inquiry. Sales of goods made for these establishments by outworkers or by other establishments from materials given out to them and sales of waste products are included. New building work and machinery or other capital items produced by establishments for hiring out or leasing are regarded as sales, the value included in the return being that adopted in the establishments' capital asset accounts. Forward sales and canteen takings are excluded. All sales in the period of the inquiry are included irrespective of when the goods were manufactured. Goods produced in one establishment and transferred either to ancillary departments not engaged in production for which there are separate accounts, or to another establishment of the same firm not covered by the return, are treated as sales by the producing establishment and valued as far as possible as if they had been sold to an independent purchaser. Goods transferred to wholesale or retail selling organisations, for which separate accounts are kept are valued on the same basis.

The value shown for sales is the "net selling value" defined as the amount (excluding value added tax) charged to customers whether on an ex-works or delivered basis, after any trade discounts and agents' commissions have been deducted. The cost of packing materials less allowances for returnable cases is included. In industries where products attract Excise Duty the value stated is usually inclusive of duty if sold duty-paid and exclusive of duty if sold in bond or exported.

22. Work done and industrial services rendered

Figures for work done represent the amount charged for work carried out on materials supplied by a customer and include repair work. Within certain industries this heading covers a wide variety of activities, for example, within the food sector — butter packed on commission; within the textile industries — making up of garments, fur dressing and textile finishing; within printing and publishing — preparatory work on type-setting, block making and binding. Work done is also significant in the electrical machinery and heavy engineering industries, covering erection, installation and repair and jobbing work. Other activities within this heading include exploration work, research and development, glass cutting and dressing and planing of timber.

Industrial services rendered include repairs and maintenance, installation work, and technical research and studies for other organisations.

23. Capital goods produced for establishments own use

This includes all work of a capital nature carried out during the year by the establishments' own staff for their own use.

24. Non-industrial services rendered

Includes rents received for commercial and industrial buildings, amounts charged for hiring out plant, machinery and other goods and amounts charged to other organisations for the provision of transport. It also includes amounts received for the right to use patents, trademarks, copyrights, etc., manufacturing and quarrying rights and technical "know-how", and revenue from such staff facilities as canteens is also included.

25. Goods merchant or factored

Merchant goods are those (excluding canteen sales) sold without having been subjected to any manufacturing process by the seller.

26. **Stocks and work in progress**

Values are given of stocks of goods on hand for sale and of materials, stores and fuel at the end of the year of return and of the change during the year, including any stocks of goods held for merchandising or factoring.

Work in progress is defined as materials which have been partially processed by the establishment but which are not usually sold or transferred to another establishment without further processing. The values include the cost of materials consumed and labour used, together with a margin of overhead costs and profits. Progress payments made to sub-contractors are excluded and progress payments received from other organisations are not deducted.

27. **Wages and salaries**

These are amounts paid during the year to operatives and to administrative, technical and clerical employees. Payments to working proprietors, whether called salaries or not, are excluded. The values shown include all overtime payments, bonuses and commissions, whether paid regularly or not, and no deduction is made for income tax, insurances, contributory pensions, etc. The value of redundancy payments, less any amounts reimbursed from Government sources, is included. The value of any payments in kind, travelling expenses, etc. is excluded.

28. **Remuneration paid to outworkers**

The remuneration paid to outworkers (i.e. persons employed by the establishment who do their work in their own homes) is generally on a piece-work basis. Only amounts paid to outworkers whose names appear on the establishment's payroll are included. Amounts paid to outworkers by sub-contractors are excluded.

29. **Employers' insurance and welfare contributions**

This item includes employers contributions to national insurance and graduated pensions (and/or earnings related basic contributions under the Social Security Act, 1973), as well as commercial insurance premiums to provide pensions, superannuation or other retirement benefits, sickness benefits, personal accident benefits, disability or death benefits for employees or former employees or their dependants. Contributions to the running costs of canteens, social centres, children's holiday homes, etc. for employees, former employees and their dependants are also included.

30. **Assisted Areas**

Within each region separate estimates of employment and net capital expenditure are available for assisted areas (special development, development, intermediate and derelict land clearance). Assisted areas are areas of high labour supply for which government grants and other help is available.

HISTORICAL RECORD OF THE CENSUS OF PRODUCTION 1907 to 1970

The reports of the censuses of production, which the Board of Trade and successor departments have conducted since 1907, together form the most comprehensive set of available statistics on industrial production in the United Kingdom. Data from the first census in 1907 up to the first of the new system of annual censuses for 1970 have been collated into one volume by the Business Statistics Office to form a unique reference work for all those interested in the growth of United Kingdom manufacturing industry since the start of the century.

The aim of the Historical Record is to classify firms mainly engaged in the same activities as consistently as possible to the same industries throughout the years. The method adopted has been to reclassify industries or parts of industries en bloc and bring them into line with the 1968 revision of the Standard Industrial Classification.
