## 116 Weatherproof outerwear

This Report on the Weatherproof Outerwear Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing raincoats, oilskins, rubber outerwear and other waterproof outerwear, including outerwear cut from plastics materials, for adults and children. Workrooms attached to retail shops are excluded.

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 441 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census. The definition of this industry however is unchanged from the last detailed Census of Production for 1963 in which it was reported (Part 93).

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
