## TEXTI IE PACKING TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Textile Packing Trade relates to establishment engaged wholly or mainly in the packing and making-up of textile goods engaged wholly or mainly in the packing and making-up of aking-up of
for other firms. The term "making-up" refers to the making for other firms. The term "making-up" refers to the making-up of
consignments of goods in different lengths, folds or shapes, or with consignments of goods in dirferent letial tickets, tapes, parcelling, etc., as required for various destinations or customers and not to the making-up of materials into finished goods such as articles of clothing.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 123(3) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

A large number of returns made in this trade for 1935 were in respect of the packing departments of merchant converters for which in 1948 separate not, therefore, strictly comparable.

Larger establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland (which are luded in 1948) accounted in 1935 for about 6 per cent. of the net excluded in the United Kingdom.
