## JUTE TRADE

IHIS REPORT on the Jute Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the spining of jute yam or the weaving of jute piece goods (except finished brattice cloth and narrow fabrics), carpets and rugs, etc.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 116 in the Standard Industrial Cl assification.

Establishments in this trade in Northern Ireland (which are excluded in 1948) accounted in 1937 and 1935 for less than 1 per cent. of the net output
for the United Kingdom.
