## METALLTFEROUS MINES AND QUARRTES

THIS REPORT on Metalliferous Mines and Quarries relates $t$ establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the mining of metalliferous establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the mining
ores (iron ore and ironstone, lead, tin, etc.; ores).

This trade corresponds to minimum list headings 11 and 19 (1) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded for both 1948 and 1935. At the 1935 Census, particulars relating to all mining and quarrying in Northern Ireland were included in the report on NonMetalliferous Mines and Quarries (other than Coal, Salt and Slate), separate particulars for each trade not being available.
