METALLIFEROUS MINES AND QUARRIES

THIS REPORT on Metalliferous Mines and Quarries relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the mining of metalliferous ores (iron ore and ironstone, lead, tin, etc., ores).

This trade corresponds to minimum list headings 11 and 19 (1) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded for both 1948 and 1935. At the 1935 Census, particulars relating to all mining and quarrying in Northern Ireland were included in the report on Non-Metalliferous Mines and Quarries (other than Coal, Salt and Slate), separate particulars for each trade not being available.

In 1948, the need to maintain the output of iron ore made it necessary for certain uneconomic mines to be kept in operation. This was achieved by means of a subsidy from public funds - the Home Ore subsidy - the amounts paid being determined after examination of working costs. Eight firms (13 establishments) in 1948 received subsidies amounting to £883,000 in aggregate. The subsidy ceased to be paid from public funds on 31st March, 1949.
