## PRINTING AND BOOKBINDING MACHINERY TRADE

 THIS REPORT on the Printing and Bookbinding Machinery Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of typesetting machinery, printing presses, ruling machines, wire stitching machinery, and cardboard box, paper bag and envelope making machinery.This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 69(8) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948; no production was recorded there in this trade for 1946, 1937 or 1935.
