## 114 Leather goods

This Report on the Leather Goods Industry relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in manufacturing trunks, suitcases, handbags, pocket books, belts, straps, harness, saddlery and other goods (except clothing) of leather or leather substitutes (including plastics and fibreglass).

This industry corresponds to minimum list heading 432 in the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) which has been used for the first time as a basis of classification in the 1968 Census.

The industry corresponds to the Leather Goods Industry (Part 91) in the Reports on the last detailed Census of Production for 1963, except that small cases of all kinds of plastics and fibreglass formerly included in the Plastics Moulding and Fabricating Industry (Part 124) are now included in this industry.

Throughout this Report, the figures given for 1963 have been reclassified, as far as possible, according to the Standard Industrial Classification (Revised 1968) so that data for 1963 and 1968 are on the same industrial basis. However the reclassification of small firms, which provided limited information only, has been arbitrary.

In this industry, where small establishments account for a relatively large proportion of employment and output, establishments employing fewer than 25 persons were asked to complete a simplified version of the full census form for 1968. For 1963 a sample of small firms was asked to complete the simplified census form, the remainder being required only to give information on employment and description of business.

In interpreting the data in the tables it is essential to bear in mind the notes and definitions which appear on pages (i) to (iv).
