#### VINEGAR AND OTHER CONDIMENTS TRADE

THIS REPORT on the Vinegar and Other Condiments Trade relates to establishments engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of vinegar, mustard and ground spices, including pepper. The trade mainly comprises establishments formerly classified in the Preserved Foods Trade, but it includes also the establishments specialising in the manufacture of vinegar which were classified in 1935 in the Aerated Waters, Cider, Vinegar and British Wines Trades. The latter trades were not covered by the 1937 Inquiry: TABLE 1 gives, as well as the full totals for 1935, figures for that year relating to the sections of the trade included in the 1937 Inquiry.

This trade corresponds to minimum list heading 162(4) in the Standard Industrial Classification.

Any establishments in Northern Ireland are excluded in 1948; no production was recorded there in this trade for 1937 or 1935.
