THE FINISHED BRASS TRADE INTRODUCTORY

This trade comprises firms that were engaged wholly or mainly in the manufacture of finished brass goods of the kinds specified in Table V, the majority of which are foundry products. Other descriptions of brass manufactures are dealt with in the reports on various metal working trades, such as brass nails, screws, bolts, nuts, rivets and washers, etc., in the Chain, Nail, Screw, etc., Trades, manufactures of brass wire in the Wire Trade and smallwares of brass in the Needle, Pin, etc., Trade, while a large output of sheet brass articles was recorded on schedules for the Hardware, Hollow-ware, etc., Trades. It should be borne in mind that brass foundry products may also be manufactured by engineering firms, motor car manufacturers and other firms for use as parts of composite products such as machinery, vehicles, etc., and may thus escape separate record in the Census results, while some further output by firms in other trades has probably been included under general descriptions which did not enable the goods to be identified

In the absence of quantitative figures of production and of detailed particulars of oversea trade, Table VI, dealing with the average values of goods produced, exported and imported, cannot be included for this trade.
