If Britain leaves Europe, criminals and terrorists who go on the run will be given a helping hand to escape British justice.

British police make full use of European police and criminal justice measures. Hussain Osman, one of the failed 21 July London bombers, placed explosives at a tube station in London before fleeing to Italy. As a result of European measures including a European Arrest Warrant, he was arrested in Rome eight days later and quickly returned to the UK to face justice.

Osman is now serving a 40 year prison sentence. In similar cases before these European measures were in place, it took up to 10 years for criminals to face justice.

These powers also help police forces work together to identify and catch networks of criminals and terrorists.


