EU funding worth £3.9million helped create Wales Coast Path, the world's first uninterrupted route along a national coast.

But did you know that EU funding has seen £80million go towards developing essential roads such as the A465 and A55, £2.8million towards renovating Welsh language and heritage centre

Nant Gwrtheryn and £1.6million into creating a tidal generator in Pembrokeshire?

The EU works with our local communities so we can channel these funds where we need them most, building projects that create jobs, bring in more money and create opportunities for young people in our region.

As well as giving us direct investment in Wales, being in the EU means more local jobs, support for our businesses, a boost for tourism, lower prices for everyday goods and a more secure future for our families.

Wales will benefit from £2.1billion in EU funding over the next five years. This could all be lost if Britain leaves Europe.
