Report of the Acting Superintendent-General of Education for the Year ending 30th September, 1916.

Department of Public Education,
Cape Town, January, 1918.

TO THE HONOURABLE THE ADMINISTRATOR.

SIR,—I have the honour to submit to you the following report on the work of the Education Department for the year ending 30th September, 1916.

The plan and arrangements of the report are essentially the same as in previous years, the object being to record the progress of Education during the year.

The completion of this Report has been regrettably delayed considerably beyond the end of the period with which it deals; at the same time it should be noted that statements of general educational progress together with details affecting School Boards and finance were reported fortnightly in the *Education Gazette*, while the Quarterly issues of that publication were devoted to Statistics with reference to enrolment, attendance, and other related matters.

I. ADMINISTRATION.

HEAD OFFICE.—The personnel of the staff has changed considerably, chiefly owing to the number of officers who have proceeded on active service. A severe strain has been put on those who remained, and it is due to these officers to record the constant loyal service which they have rendered in seeking to cope with an increasing amount of work under circumstances of considerable difficulty.

INSPECTORATE.—Mr. H. G. Kreft, B.A., Senior Dutch master of the South African College High School, Cape Town, was appointed to the inspectorate in room of Mr. J. S. Pressly, M.A., who had retired on pension. He was placed in charge of the Circuit comprising the Divisions of Albert, Aliwal North, and Herschel.

The late Mr. W. Fouche, formerly Principal of Robertson Boys' High School was engaged temporarily as an Inspector, his duties consisting of the inspection of student teachers in Training Colleges with regard to their ability to teach through the medium of Dutch.

LEGISLATION.—Much important Educational Legislation was enacted by the Provincial Council during the session of 1916. In order the Ordinances were:—

1. Education (Language Certificate) Ordinance, No. 3 of 1916.
2. Teachers' Pension Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916.
3. School Board Act Further Amendment Ordinance, No. 5 of 1916.
4. Education (Payment of School Fees) Ordinance, No. 11 of 1916.
5. Teachers' Discipline Ordinance, No. 15 of 1916.

It may be desirable to indicate generally the scope of these enactments. The Education (Language Certificate) Ordinance No. 3 of 1916 provided for the examination of acting teachers with reference to their ability to teach through the medium of the two official languages. Two certificates were to be granted (*a*) a Lower Bilingual Certificate for those who showed themselves competent to give instruction through the medium of both English and Dutch in any of the School subjects up to and including Standard IV and (*b*) a Higher Bilingual Certificate for those who were competent to give instruction through the medium of both English and Dutch in any of the School subjects up to and including Standard VII.

The Teachers' Pension Ordinance No. 4 of 1916 provides that a teacher may retire or be retired on pension at the age of 55 instead of 60 as heretofore, when such retirement is in the public interest.

3. This Ordinance dealt with various points such as (*a*) procedure to be followed in appointing a teacher, (*b*) management of schools by Committees, (*c*) appointment of election officers, (*d*) how legal costs are to be met, (*e*) surety to be given by servants of School Boards, (*f*) disqualification of members of Committees for non-attendance, and (*g*) medical inspection of pupils.

4. By this Ordinance provision was made for the payment of the School Fees of children of persons on Active Service, and of persons killed or disabled on Active Service.

5. This Ordinance conferred on the Administrator or on the Superintendent-General of Education if delegated thereto, the power to enquire into any charge of misconduct by a teacher, and on the Administrator the power to suspend or dismiss any teacher convicted of such charge.

LANGUAGE ORDINANCE.—In January 1916, all the Inspectors of Schools assembled in conference in Cape Town at the request of the Honourable the Administrator, who fully explained the provisions of the Ordinance. Difficulties were discussed and solutions offered.

In July 1916, the Executive Committee of the Province appointed four gentlemen to assist School Boards in the introduction and application of the Language Ordinance, namely: The Rev. P. G. J. Meiring, B.A.; The Rev. J. C. Truter; Mr. C. L. Hofmeyr, B.A. and Prof. W. E. Malherbe, B.A., B.Sc.

The Rev. Mr. Meiring and Prof. Malherbe, visited the towns of the Western portion of the Province, while the Rev. Mr. Truter and Mr. Hofmeyr devoted their attention to the Eastern portion.

Meetings were held by these organisers with School Boards, School Committees, Parents and Teachers, in each case the Circuit Inspector being present. It is reported by the Inspectors that the Organisers exercised great tact, and were successful in bringing about a better attitude towards the Ordinance, particularly with the parents, most of whose opposition was due to mis-interpretation and misunderstanding of the Ordinance. There is every reason to believe that the visits of these organisers resulted in much good.

In July 1916, eight gentlemen were appointed to act as examiners for the Language (Lower Bilingual) Certificate. They were grouped in pairs. There follows their names together with the areas allotted to them.

- (a) Messrs. A. Dreyer and H. K. J. v. d. Spuy, B.A., Western and North Western.
 (b) Messrs. S. G. Joubert, B.A., and P. J. le Roux, South West and Midland.
 (c) Dr. B. J. Haarhoff and H. J. J. v. d. Walt, B.A., Northern and North Eastern.
 (d) Messrs. Besselaar and J. C. Pauw, Eastern and Border.

The Lower Bilingual Certificate was gained by 2,085 teachers, a very creditable percentage of School Board teachers.

II. SUPPLY OF SCHOOLS.

At the end of September 1916, there were in operation 4,767 schools under the control of the Department, the net increase for the year being 145. Practically the whole increase occurred in Third Class Public Schools for Europeans, in Mission Schools, and in Schools for Aborigines. White Schools increased in number by 90 and Native and Coloured Schools by 55. The number of Poor Schools was reduced by 8, these being reclassified as Third Class Schools.

EUROPEAN SCHOOLS.—In the subjoined table are given, arranged according to grade, the numbers of State-aided Schools for European children at 30th September, 1916. For purposes of comparison the corresponding details for 1915 are included.

A new Industrial School was opened in January, 1916 at Knysna. Carpentry is the subject of instruction, the proximity of the forests making this appropriate. Unfortunately there is no market at hand for the sale of the articles manufactured in the institution.

There are now 9 of these schools for Europeans, 6 for boys and 3 for girls. The course of instruction comprises such subjects of the elementary school course as Reading, Writing, Composition, Spelling and Arithmetic. For boys are added occupations such as Carpentry, Wagonmaking, Blacksmithing, Tailoring, Shoemaking, Printing, Bookbinding and Gardening, while the vocational subjects for girls are Cookery, Dressmaking, and Laundrywork.

So far these schools have only been provided for Indigents but scholars attending other types of schools are taught Cookery and Carpentry.

The Second Class Public School at Piquetberg was advanced in grade and became a First Class School. Slot van de Paarl Third Class School became a Second Class School.

NON-EUROPEAN SCHOOLS.—In the subjoined tables are given, arranged according to grade, the numbers of State-aided Schools for Native and Coloured children at 30th September, 1916. For purposes of comparison the corresponding details for 1915 are included.

III. ENROLMENT AND ATTENDANCE.

EUROPEAN CHILDREN.—The total number of pupils enrolled at the end of September, 1916, was 111,067. This was an advance for the twelve months under review of 5,325 pupils. The average annual increase for the five years immediately preceding was 3,400. Thus the normal increase was exceeded by close on 2,000, which must be considered satisfactory.

NON-EUROPEAN CHILDREN.—The number enrolled has now reached the number of 142,995. This represents an advance of 5,757 pupils over the previous year.

EUROPEAN AND NON-EUROPEAN CHILDREN.—The total number of pupils was 254,062, an advance of 11,082 for the year.

Unfortunately the average attendance has fallen from 87.3 per cent. in 1915 to 86.5 per cent. in 1916. Even allowing for the well-known difficulties in the way of regular attendance, it is felt that the average attendance should be higher. More can be done by some of the School Boards to enforce the regulations and so ensure the more regular attendance of pupils. Still more can be done, especially in the scattered areas, by the teachers, who by enthusiastically exercising an unremitting vigilance over the attendance of the pupils, may render great assistance.

Many of the inspectors make remarks on the matter of attendance, but it will suffice to quote from two of them. Inspector Robertson says:—"The very satisfactory state of matters in Robertson is no doubt directly due to the action of the School Board. The Principals of the various schools have to send in a monthly return giving the names of those pupils who have attended irregularly without a sufficient excuse. The Board then communicate with the parents concerned, and if necessary, takes action to compel the parents to send their children more regularly to school."

Inspector Spurway remarks:—"Every parent living in a School Board area should be compelled by law to furnish to the School Board every quarter a report showing how many of his children of school-going age are not attending any school. A penalty for neglecting to furnish such report would be necessary. The Boards would then have up to date information as to what children had not been provided with educational facilities and could then, in some cases at least, take steps to provide them."

IV. INSPECTION OF SCHOOLS.

The number of Circuit Inspectors was increased from 37 to 38. Additional to these were the Inspectors of High Schools and Training Colleges, and two relieving Inspectors.

Further owing to the necessity of employing two of the Inspectors, one as Language Organiser and one as Bilingual Certificate Examiner, the late Mr. W. Fouché was engaged as a temporary inspector.

4,649 inspections were conducted by these officers as against 4,642 in 1915.

The informal visits numbered 2,531 as against 2,785 in the previous year. This decrease is explained by the fact that the Circuit Inspectors were engaged for varying periods in accompanying the Language Organisers.

The Departmental Instructors and Instructresses to the number of thirteen were engaged in organising and controlling the teaching given in Drawing, Singing, Woodwork, Needlework, Kindergarten method, Cookery and Nature Study. 2,547 visits were made compared with 2,651 in 1915. The decreased number of visits was due to the fact that two of these officers were laid aside for a considerable period by sickness.

Miss Fuechsel retired from service in June, 1916. For more than 22 years she discharged the duties of Instructress of Needlework with zeal and efficiency. The vacancy was filled by the appointment of Miss Cairncross, needlework instructress at the Cape Town Training College.

V., VI. ATTAINMENTS AND PROGRESS OF PUPILS.

The educational system is two-fold, Primary and Secondary. The curriculum for Primary Schools embraces Reading, Recitation, Writing, Composition, Grammar, Arithmetic, Geography, History, Singing, Drill, Drawing, Needlework and Nature Study, while in many cases Woodwork and Gardening are added. This course is intended for normal boys and girls aged 5 to 14. The Standards through which the pupils pass are seven in number, and a normal child, after two years in the Kindergarten, entering Standard I at the age of 7 should complete the course by the time he is 14. It is generally agreed among educationalists that at this stage a considerable portion of the time of the pupils should be devoted to manual training. This is provided in the curriculum by the inclusion of Drawing, Needlework, Gardening and Woodwork. In addition the pupils undergo instruction in essential subjects such as Reading, Arithmetic, Composition, etc. There may be and is difference of opinion, as to the arrangement of and time provision for the subjects mentioned above in a Code or Course, but there can be none as to their inclusion.

Secondary Education is provided in High Schools and in the upper portion of the Central School of a district. It is intended normally for pupils from 12 or 13 years of age to 17 or 18 years. It thus deals with education during the anxious and difficult time of adolescence. Less prominence is now given to manual exercises, and more to an attempt to give the pupils some general culture. Thus the study of Latin, History, and Literature is encouraged, while Mathematics and Science figure prominently in the scheme. In High Schools for Girls more and more weight is being laid on the teaching of Cookery and Domestic Science.

In all schools under the control of School Boards Religious Instruction is given daily, in accordance with a definite syllabus, specifically constructed for the purpose.

An annual inspection is held in each school, and an individual examination of the pupils both oral and written is conducted by the inspector. The question of the continuance of individual inspection is one that is greatly debated. Without expressing an opinion here on this difficult question it should be recorded that certain inspectors have alluded to the matter in their reports and have written as a result of their experience. Thus Inspector Golightly says *inter alia*: "It is easy to say that teachers know best what their children can do, and are therefore in the best position to know when to promote them, but in practice, and without the moral support afforded by the annual inspection, it would, at all events in country places, end in promotion being practically placed in the hands of parents." Inspector Rosenow evidently allowed some latitude to teachers to promote where they saw fit, and now deplors that "teachers of limited experience often allow their better judgment to be overruled by the wishes of parents." He continues further: "In one or two schools where there were failures last year, almost every pupil was promoted, though an examination of the records plainly showed that the promotion should never have been made. The result was in most cases disappointment and failure for a second year in succession, while it would not be too much to say that the work of the schools concerned was very adversely affected."

The following tables show the number of pupils in each of the standards of the school after inspection. The figures for 1915 are in each case given for purposes of comparison.

The greater proportion of the pupils in High School Standard E enter for the Matriculation examination of the Cape University. At the examination held in December, 1916, 1,771 candidates, drawn from all parts of South Africa, presented themselves, of whom 1,275 succeeded in passing. 22 candidates gained places in Class I (bursary division), of whom 16 hailed from the Cape Province, 4 from the Transvaal and 2 from Natal.

NON-EUROPEAN CHILDREN: PRIMARY EDUCATION.—In the subjoined table will be seen the distribution of the pupils in the various standards after inspection, and alongside the corresponding figures for 1915.

50,889 pupils (non-European) were presented for inspection in Standards, and 34,905 or nearly 69 per cent. succeeded in passing. Again, of 19,364 pupils who were present at two consecutive inspections in the same school, 12,695 passed. This percentage of 65 might with reason have been expected to be at all events higher than 69, as pupils who remain steadily at one school should do better than those who move from one place to another.

NON-EUROPEAN CHILDREN: SECONDARY EDUCATION.—This is confined, with the exception of pupil teacher classes, to the First Class Public School at Lovedale, where there were 52 non-European children present at the end of September, 1916. The corresponding figure for 1915 was 66.

VII. SPECIAL SUBJECTS OF INSTRUCTION.

Greater attention has been paid by the Instructors than previously to Training Colleges and Schools where pupil teachers were being trained. It is felt that by ensuring that these young teachers go forth well equipped in the best methods of teaching, sounder work may confidently be expected especially in the smaller rural schools. It is now possible, owing to the provision that every pupil teacher must spend at least one year in a Training College, for the Departmental Instructors to have the opportunity of giving instruction to every future teacher. Inspector Scott says with reference to the value of this year in Training Colleges: "There are several newly-fledged teachers who wish that they could have enjoyed for two years instead of one the advantages of a recognised Training Centre."

DRAWING.—Prior to the appointment of the present Instructors of Drawing, no subject in the Elementary School Course was more neglected. The progress made in the teaching of this subject since then has been steady and has kept pace with the increase in the number of pupils undergoing instruction. While much remains to be done, there are many schools where astonishingly meritorious work is being accomplished. The most hopeful feature of all is that the quality of the work at the Training Colleges is improving rapidly. The Statistics for 1896, 1906 and 1916 are given for purposes of comparison.

SINGING.—Great aptitude for Singing is shown both by European and non-European pupils. In fact, as is very fitting, no subject is more popular both with teachers and scholars. The new proceedings whereby in some Training Colleges the students are divided into groups of about 20 students each, who then choose one of their number to act as conductor, and proceed to compete as choirs against one another, should further stimulate the teaching of the subject, and should provide competent and recognised conductors who will take charge of the choirs in the schools in which they will later be located.

NEEDLEWORK.—It is axiomatic that the women of South Africa are very gifted in the use of the needle. In great measure this is the result of systematic teaching, due to the unremitting efforts of the Instructresses, and moreover due to the fact that a sensible and practical course of instruction has been followed.

WOODWORK.—The scarcity and expense of timber and implements have been serious obstacles to progress, but the position with regard to the number of pupils receiving instruction in this subject has been well maintained.

COOKERY.—The value of this subject as necessary for girls is recognised. Unfortunately the initial and current expenses, as in the case of Woodwork, are heavy. This fact together with a scarcity of competent teachers has so far prevented the progress which would otherwise undoubtedly have been made.

NATURE STUDY.—This subject has now a recognised place in the curriculum of all the best schools. The younger teachers, trained in Training Colleges, value the importance of training the children to observe and record the occurrences of Nature. School Gardens have been established at 71 schools. Unfortunately school sites in the country are usually pieces of stony land incapable of cultivation and without an adequate supply of water. Much cannot be done, but it is wonderful what an enthusiastic teacher can accomplish in the way of tree and flower cultivation even under these conditions. It is almost unnecessary to mention the beneficial and refining effect beautiful and cared-for surroundings have on the character and nature of the pupils.

PHYSICAL TRAINING.—Drill is taught in practically all the schools. In too many cases it is regarded as a subject, the teacher, with an eye on the Annual Inspection, being more concerned in getting up several exercises, than in making the exercises the means of improving the physique and carriage of the pupils.

VIII. TEACHERS.

QUALIFICATIONS HELD BY TEACHERS.—The number of teachers under the Department at 30th June, 1916, was 9,743, being an increase for the year of 450. Of these 6,439 were the holders of a professional certificate. This number represents a percentage of 66. Of the 34 per cent. remaining, many were partially qualified, that is, they had passed the examination for the First Year or Second Year pupil teacher certificate, but had not completed the course. At the same time the percentage of uncertificated teachers, while lower than in 1915, was still unduly high.

In the schools of the Province, excluding the Native Territories, the number of certificated teachers was 74 per cent. of the total.

The following table gives an analysis of the qualifications, academic and professional, of these 9,743 teachers.

The policy of the Department with regard to the employment of uncertificated teachers is (a) not to remove an uncertificated teacher who has in the past received an unconditional appointment and (b) to appoint an uncertificated teacher only where there is no certificated applicant, and even then only temporarily if there is a likelihood of securing a certificated teacher later.

The distribution of uncertificated teachers, arranged according to Inspector's Circuits is given in the table below, from which it will be seen (a) that most of the uncertificated teachers worked in the Native Territories (b) that Border districts such as Aliwal North, Fort Beaufort and Kingwilliamstown with big native populations had a high percentage of uncertificated teachers (c) that the North Western districts of which Piquetberg, Fraserburg and Van Rhynsdorp are the headquarters were badly off for qualified teachers, (d) that the districts which include the towns of Cape Town, Stellenbosch, Paarl, Worcester, Oudtshoorn, Port Elizabeth, East London, Grahamstown and Kimberley had less than 20 per cent. of uncertificated teachers.

The percentage of males was thus 35.06 as against 35.62, a decrease of one-half per cent. for the year.

The number of boy pupil teachers should be increased. The improved salaries offered to teachers will probably induce a larger number of boys to offer themselves for training in the future. The question of payment for pupil teachers, however, is one that requires consideration. Remuneration at the rate of £12, £16 and £20 per annum for the three years of the pupil teacher course respectively does not seem attractive.

SUPPLY OF TEACHERS.—The pupil teacher system is the main course of our supply of teachers. It is satisfactory to note that the number of pupil teachers in training is advancing steadily. From the summary below it will be seen that each succeeding year finds an addition of close on 600 student-teachers, engaged on the prescribed three years course of study. Unfortunately there is a considerable wastage of teachers. To check this to a certain extent, the Department is advocating greater centralisation of schools, the result of which should be that each teacher should be engaged in teaching a higher average number of pupils than at present. With these two processes going on concurrently, namely, the increased output of teachers and the prevention to a certain extent of wastage, the supply of trained teachers should within measurable time meet the demand.

It is satisfactory also to be able to record an increased number of students who gained the T2 Certificate. For several years the number has been declining. 111 took this Certificate as against 91 in 1915.

IX. LIBRARIES.

No Departmental grants were available for the purchase of books for School Libraries. Consequently the little that was done in the way of adding to existing libraries or of providing new libraries was accomplished entirely by local effort. It will be seen from the figures below that 13 more Third Class and Poor Schools have libraries now than in 1915. On the other hand there are 57 less Private Farm Schools possessing Libraries. This is a matter which should have the urgent attention of School Board Secretaries. If a Private Farm School possessing a Library to which a Departmental grant in aid was made closes down, the Library should be returned to the School Board and passed on to another School. Altogether there were 2,238 schools possessing Libraries and 2,529 without. Of 2,855 European schools 2,075 possessed Libraries. All First Class Schools, Second Class Schools and Training Colleges possessed Libraries. In the following table are given the statistics for the years 1916 and 1915 for other classes of schools.

X. SCHOOL BUILDINGS.

The existing war conditions resulting in greatly increased prices of building material, the necessity for economy and the tightness of the money market have all combined to necessitate a restriction in the amount of building. In many places, however, it was absolutely imperative that new buildings should be erected, while in others the existing fabric had to be extended or repaired. The expenditure for the year amounted to £110,324 2s. 9d. Among the most notable new erections were:—

SCHOOL BOARD FINANCE.—At the end of 1915, School Boards had under their control 2,653 schools, staffed by 4,937 teachers, with an enrolment of 95,936 scholars, the corresponding figures for 1914 being respectively 2,495 schools, 4,694 teachers and 91,332. Thus there were 243 additional teachers. These figures should be borne in mind when consideration is given to the following statement of Income and Expenditure.

XII. CONCLUSION.

A brief survey of the foregoing pages will show where progress has been made during the year. In most respects it will be found that progress has not been sensational but steady. Thus the supply of schools has increased by 90 for White pupils and 55 for non-European pupils. The school enrolment reached 254,062; of these 111,067 were European children. There still remains a considerable number of children not in attendance at school and further efforts will have to be made to bring in these children.

4,649 inspections were conducted by the inspectors in 1916, and 2,531 informal visits were made. The ideal number of schools to be inspected by each inspector should be such that he would be able to give each school the benefit of his advice during an Annual Informal Visit, besides making a visit for the Annual Inspection. That means that each Inspector should control roughly about 100 schools. To attain this ideal would involve the engagement of 9 additional Inspectors.

A gratifying feature is the increase in the number of student-teachers, the advance being for the year 600. Eventually the supply of trained teachers should equal the demand. The principal section of teachers is that holding the Third Class certificate. It is an indubitable fact that student-teachers qualifying for this Certificate are now receiving a good training and a fair education, and are much better equipped for the work of teaching than was the case with similar students but a few years ago.

It is satisfactory to be able to report that 20 more students took the Second Class (T.2) Certificate this year than last. There is also an increase of 28 in the number of those holding the First Class Certificate.

There is nothing specially noteworthy to record in connection with the attainments of pupils. 87 per cent. of the pupils succeeded in passing. The inspectors report in general that sound methods of teaching are in practice.

Steady progress in most of the Special Subjects of Instruction for which Instructors have been appointed is to be reported. Needlework and Singing have for several years been at a high level. Drawing, formerly in a backward state, has recently made giant strides and may be expected to become quite satisfactory in a few years.

During the year the Language Ordinance was brought more fully into operation. Through the tact of the Language Organisers, the whole-hearted efforts of the Inspectors, and the Co-operation and goodwill of School Boards and teachers the change came into being without friction. It is reported that the system is working well.

This report should not be concluded without tribute to the office staff. On the outbreak of war there were thirty-seven men engaged in the office. Of these twenty-one went to the front in one or other field of operations. During the year 1916, three of them made the great sacrifice, namely, R. S. Wale, E. Hopper and C. H. Day. A former clerk, D. de Bruyn, also fell on the field of battle. Fifteen men remained in the office, all of whom were either over military age or were rejected by the military authorities. They, with the aid of temporary clerks, have laboured devotedly and cheerfully to discharge the extra burden thrown on them.
