REPORT

ON THE

Fourth Census of the Population of the Union of South Africa, 4th May, 1926.

PART XI—PERSONAL OCCUPATION AND INDUSTRY WITH WHICH CONNECTED (EUROPEAN POPULATION).

INTRODUCTION.

THE thirteen tables published in this part of the Report are a selection of the full tabulation of the occupations and industries of the European population. The length of the list of different occupations found in the Union is such that to publish all the information correlated, in its various aspects, with other items such as age, birthplace, etc., and each of these in the various important centres of industry would produce a volume too bulky for practical purposes apart from the expense of printing. The size of the publication has, therefore, been reduced, by including only the more useful items of information for general purposes: but for the information of those interested in the subject further detailed statistics are available in the Census Office for reference.

The question in the Census form in regard to occupation appeared as shown hereunder:—

J.—State the INDUSTRY, TRADE, PROFESSION, INSTITUTION, or SERVICE in which employed. (For domestic servants and others in private personal service, write "Private Service." For persons occupied in unpaid domestic duties at home, write "Home duties"). Before replying to J, K, and L please study the examples and read the instructions given.

K.—State precise personal occupation from which income is mainly derived. Distinguish between Dealers and Makers or Manufacturers. (If retired from business, of independent means, or if living solely on a pension, state accordingly).

L.—If employing any one (European or non-European) for purposes of business..... write 1.
If working on own account but not employing any one for purposes of business..... write 2.
If working for an employer..... write 3.
If at present out of a job..... write 4.
If retired from business, of independent means, or living solely on pension..... write 5.

The tables dealing with personal occupations represent the occupations of individuals while the industry tables reflect the number of persons employed by the various grouped industries irrespective of the nature of the work performed by the individual. Table 8 is a combined table which shows the personal occupation followed in each industry, trade or service.

Tabulation has been confined to persons of 15 years of age and over, no account having been taken of the few individuals below that age who returned an occupation on the Census forms.

No comparative tables have been included in this Part, firstly, for the reason that such tables are too unwieldy to accommodate on a printed page and, secondly, because the classification of occupations adopted differed in some important respects from that of previous censuses.

The classification of the occupations of the people is one of the most involved operations undertaken in connexion with a population census. The chief difficulties are those of classification—no easy matter when the numerous designations and synonyms to be found on the census forms are taken into consideration. Even when classification has been effected, separate tabulation in respect of age, sex, marital condition, birthplace, etc., is necessary for the purpose of adequate analysis.

Of the primary data required the following are the most important:—

- (i) The personal occupation or craft.
- (ii) The industry in which that personal occupation is carried out, e.g., a carpenter in the building trade, or in the mining industry or in shipbuilding, etc.; an electrician in municipal service, or in the engineering, or in the building trade, etc.
- (iii) The status which the individual holds in relation to occupation, e.g., independent worker, proprietor, wage-labourer, etc.
- (iv) The status which the individual holds in relation to the industry, e.g., manager, foreman, journeyman, clerk, etc.

Given these primary data, it is further possible to throw light on various social aspects of the population and industrial problems of the country by relating the information to other details given in the Census form about the individual.

The preparation and careful scrutiny of all this information demands time, especially as practically all other details of the Census have to be worked out before the tables referred to in the preceding paragraph can be prepared.

The sexes have been dealt with separately in the tables in this report; but for simplification in printing it must be understood that the masculine designation of an occupation applies equally to either sex, e.g., fisherman may be either a man or woman; similarly the terms manager, foreman, or nurseryman are used to indicate either manager or manageress, foreman or forewoman, etc. The term nurse includes both male and female nurses.

For convenience of printing, English and Afrikaans translations of headings appear on alternate pages in certain tables.

The following tables, not published in this report, are available for reference in the Census Office:—

1. Detailed occupations and ages for each province and each of the ten principal towns.
2. Detailed occupations and principal religions for Union and each province.
3. Detailed occupations and grade of employment for Kimberley and Suburbs, Pietermaritzburg and Suburbs, Johannesburg and Suburbs, Germiston and Suburbs and Bloemfontein and Suburbs.
4. Detailed occupations and parentage for Kimberley and Suburbs, Pietermaritzburg and Suburbs, Johannesburg and Suburbs, Germiston and Suburbs and Bloemfontein and Suburbs.
5. Detailed occupations and birthplaces for each of the ten principal towns.
6. Detailed occupations and period of residence in the Union for each of the ten principal towns.
7. Detailed industries and ages for each of the ten principal towns.

RAPPORT

OOR DIE

Vierde Sensus van die Bevolking van die Unie van Suid-Afrika, 4 Mei 1926.

DEEL XI—PERSOONLIKE BEROEP EN INDUSTRIËË WAARMEE VERBONDE (EUROPESE BEVOLKING).

INLEIDING.

Die dertien tabelle gepubliseer in hierdie deel van die Rapport is 'n seleksie van die volledige tabellasië van die beroep en industrieë van die Europese bevolking. Die lys van die beroep wat in die Unie voorkom, is so lank dat, as alle besonderhede van die verskillende vertakkings, in verband met leeftyd, geboorteplek, ens., en elk van hulle nog in die verskillende nywerheidssentra, gepubliseer moet word, dit 'n te lywige boekdeel vir praktiese doeleindes sou wees, afgesien nog van die drukkoste. Die grootte van die uitgawe is dus beperk deur alleen die besonderhede wat, oor die algemeen, die nuttigste informasie bevat, in te sluit. Vir persone wat meer besonderhede nodig het, is verdere uitgebreide statistieke by die Sensuskantoor beskikbaar.

Op die Sensusvorm kom die kwessie van beroep as volg voor:

J.—Meld die NYWERHEID, AMBAG, PROFESSIE, INRIGTING, of DIENS waarin gewerk word. (Vir huisbedienendes en andere in private persoonlike diens, vul in „Privaat”; vir persone verbonde aan onbetaalde huislike werk, vul in „Huiswerk”.)

Alvorens J, K, en L te beantwoord, geliewe die voorbeelde te bestudeer en die instruksies oor te lees.

K.—Meld die regte persoonlike beroep waarvan die meeste inkomste verkry word. Maak onderskeid tussen Handelaars en Makers of Fabrikante. (Meld in ander gevalle „afgetree” of onafhanklike „inkomste” of „lewe uitsluitend van 'n pensioen”.)

L.—Indien iemand (Europeaan of nie-Europeaan) in diens gehou word vir besigheid.....Vul in 1. Indien vir ei rekening werkende, sonder werksmense.....Vul in 2.

Indien vir 'n werkgewer werkende.....Vul in 3.

Indien nou sonder werk.....Vul in 4.

Indien afgetree of onafhanklik of lewend uitsluitlik van pensioen'.....Vul in 5.

Die tabelle wat handel oor persoonlike beroepe, gee die beroepe van persone, terwyl die tabelle wat handel oor industrie, die getal persone gee, wat deur die verskillende gegroepeerde industrieë in diens geneem is, afgesien van die aard van die werk wat die persoon self verrig. Tabel 8 is 'n gekombineerde tabel wat die persoonlike beroep wat in elke industrie, besigheid of diens gevvolg word, weergee.

Net persone van 15 jaar en daarbo is getabellier; geen noties is geneem van die paar persone onder daardie ouderdom wat hulle beroep op die sensusvorm aangegee het nie.

In hierdie deel verskyn geen vergelykende tabelle nie, omrede dat sulke tabelle te groot is om op een blad gedruk te word, en ook omdat die klassifikasie van die beroepe in sommige belangrike gevalle verskil van die van vorige Sensusse.

Die klassifikasie van die beroepe van die bevolking is een van die ingewikkeldste onderneming in verband met 'n bevolkingsensus. Die grootste moeilikheid is die van klassifikasie, wat geen maklike taak is as die talryke benaminge en sinonieme wat op die sensusvorm aangetref word, in ag geneem word nie. Al is die klassifikasie ook al klaar, is daar nog aparte tabellasië in verband met leeftyd, geslag, burgerlike stand, geboorteplek, ens., nodig, vir voldoende ontleding.

Van die primêre gegewens wat nodig is, is die volgende die belangrikste:—

- (i) Die persoonlike beroep of ambag.
- (ii) Die industrie waarin die persoonlike beroep uitgeoefen word, b.v., 'n timmerman in die bouvak, of in die myn-industrie of in skeepsbou, ens.; 'n elektrisien in munisipale diens of in ingenieurswerk of in die bouvak, ens.
- (iii) Die Stand waarin die persoon is met betrekking tot die beroep, b.v., onafhanklike werker, eienaar, dagloner, ens.
- (iv) Die stand waarin die persoon is met betrekking tot die industrie, b.v., bestuurder, voorman, ambagsman, klerk, ens.

Met behulp van hierdie primêre gegewens is dit moontlik om verder lig te werp op verskillende sosiale aspekte van die bevolking en industriële probleme van die land, deur die informasie met ander besonderhede wat op die sensus vorm omtrent die persoon aangegee is, in verband te bring.

Die voorbereiding en noukeurige ondersoek van al hierdie informasie vereis tyd veral omdat feitlik al die ander besonderhede van die sensus uitgewerk moet word, voordat die tabelle, waarvan in die vorige paragraaf melding gemaak is, opgetrek kan word.

Die geslagte is in die tabelle in hierdie rapport apart behandel; maar omdat die drukwerk te vergemaklik moet dit onthou word dat die manlike aanduiding van 'n beroep vir albei geslagte van toepassing is b.v., visser kan 'n man of 'n vrou wees; net so ook word die terme bestuurder, opsigter of boomkweker gebruik om beide bestuurder of bestuurster, opsigter of opsigter, ens., aan te dui. Die term verpleegster sluit beide manlike en vroulike verpleegsters in.

Om die druk te vergemaklik is daar Engelse en Afrikaanse vertalinge van die hoofde op teenoorstaande bladsye in sekere tabelle.

Die volgende tabelle, wat nie in die rapport gepubliseer is nie, is vir referensie beskikbaar in die Sensuskantoor:—

1. Volledige beroepe en leeftye vir elke provinsie in elk van die tien vernaamste stede.
2. Volledige beroepe en vernaamste godsdiens vir die Unie in elk provinsie.
3. Volledige beroepe en graad van indiensneming vir Kimberley en voorstede, Pietermaritzburg en voorstede, Johannesburg en voorstede, Germiston en voorstede en Bloemfontein en voorstede.
4. Volledige beroepe en afkoms vir Kimberley en voorstede, Pietermaritzburg en voorstede, Johannesburg en voorstede, Germiston en voorstede en Bloemfontein en voorstede.
5. Volledige beroepe en geboorteplek vir elk van die tien vernaamste stede.
6. Volledige beroepe en periode van verblyf in die Unie vir elk van die tien vernaamste stede.
7. Volledige industrieë en leeftye vir die tien vernaamste stede.
