Millions of jobs depend on our EU membership, providing growth and investment for our country. British workers have enhanced rights and our consumers are better protected.

Just a few miles separate us from mainland Europe and our history and peoples are closely linked. However, the relationship between us hasn't always been good. For large periods of time it was characterised by conflict and suffering. Two world wars in the first half of the 20th Century are a stark reminder of Europe's past.

This was brought home to me recently when I was honoured to meet my constituent John Ainsworth, a Normandy veteran, who reminded me just how far we have come since those dark days of the early 1940s.

After 1945 good people from John's generation across Europe came together to prevent this from ever happening again. They wanted a Europe safe for their children where conflict was replaced with peace and poverty with prosperity. Where nations would make

deliberate choices to work, trade and cooperate together. This was the start of the European Union and is why John believes Britain must vote to remain on 23 June.

The European Union is now a global powerhouse with over 500 million consumers.





It's the biggest and best place to do business in the world and almost half of Britain's exports go to EU countries, worth over £220 billion a year to our economy. Being a part of the EU creates and secures jobs for millions of British people.

Companies from all over the world come here, because we're in the EU, and employ British people. From car making and high-tech industry to financial services, jobs and opportunities across Britain are reliant on our country being in the EU. In the future new markets in digital services, energy and tourism could provide around 790,000 more jobs by 2030 – if we remain in the EU.

And it's not just businesses that gain from our EU membership. Working people and their families are protected with paid maternity and paternity leave, equal pay and minimum paid holiday.



Britain's farmers and our countryside benefit from our EU membership. In Wales between 2014-2020, the agriculture sector will receive around £2 billion of European funding.
