In order to put the greatest possible amount of united pressure on Parliament, in support of the Conciliation Committee's Bill, the Executive Committee of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies proposes that a joint demonstration should be held of all societies that support Woman Suffrage and suggests that this demonstration should take the form of a series of separate daily meetings, extending over a week and culminating, if possible, in a joint monster Meeting.

The Committee earnestly begs that your society will co-operate in this effort, as its complete success will largely depend on its being made by a combination of as many societies as possible, interested in Woman Suffrage.

The Committee would be glad to hear from you as soon as convenient as to what share your society would be willing to take in such a demonstration and what date would be most convenient to you, if you agreed to adopt the suggestion.
